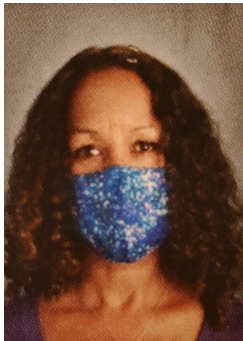
Monika Johnson-McPherson

Resource Instructional Paraprofessional

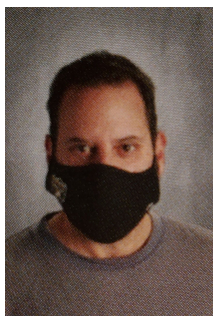

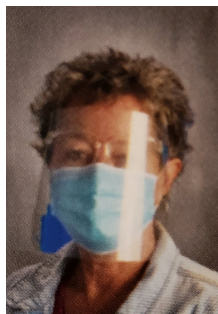

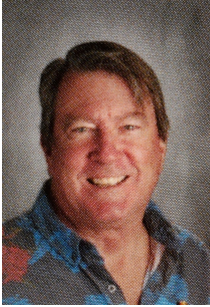
Chase Chevallier

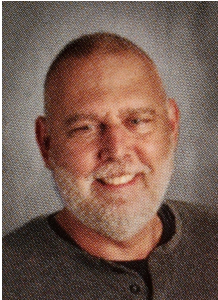
Amber Clayton

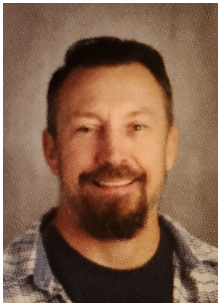
John Cowan

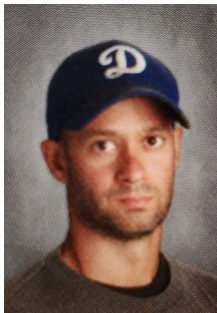
Lance Daniels

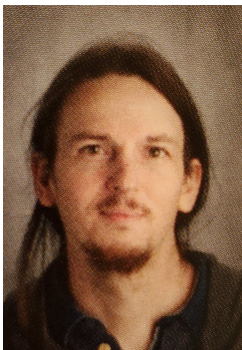
Eva Horvath

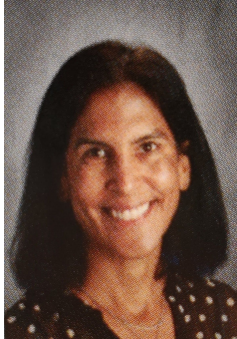


T. LaMichael Williams

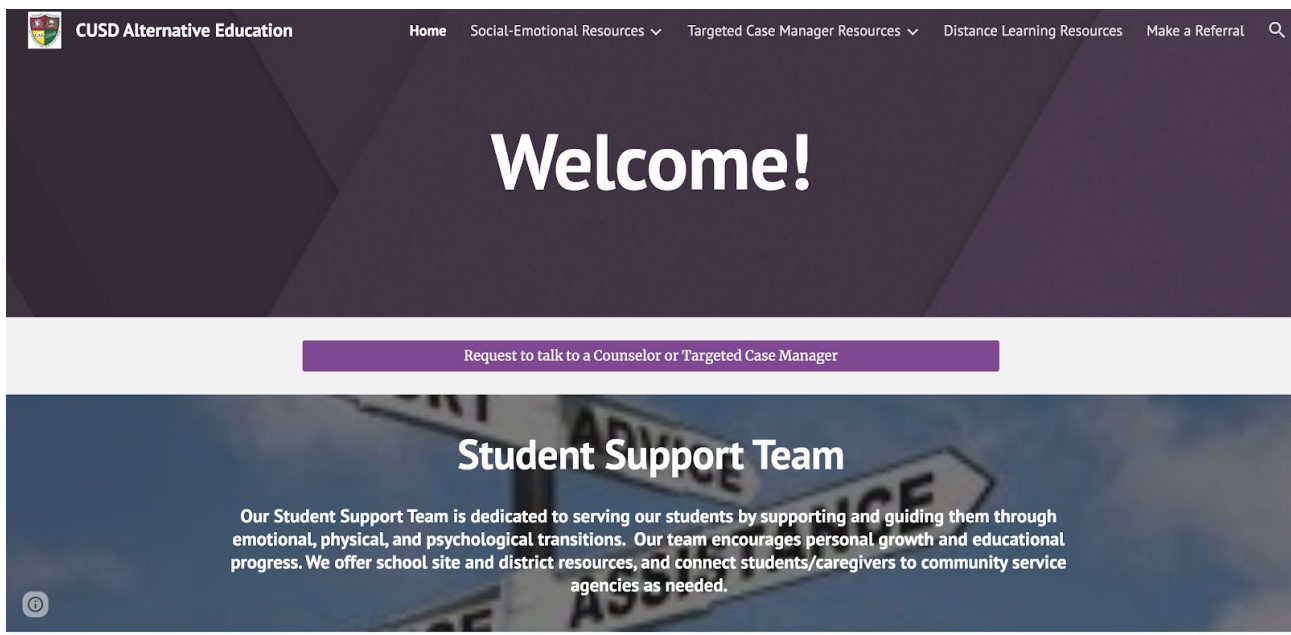

- I will leave campus promptly when I am excused for the day though the cafeteria.

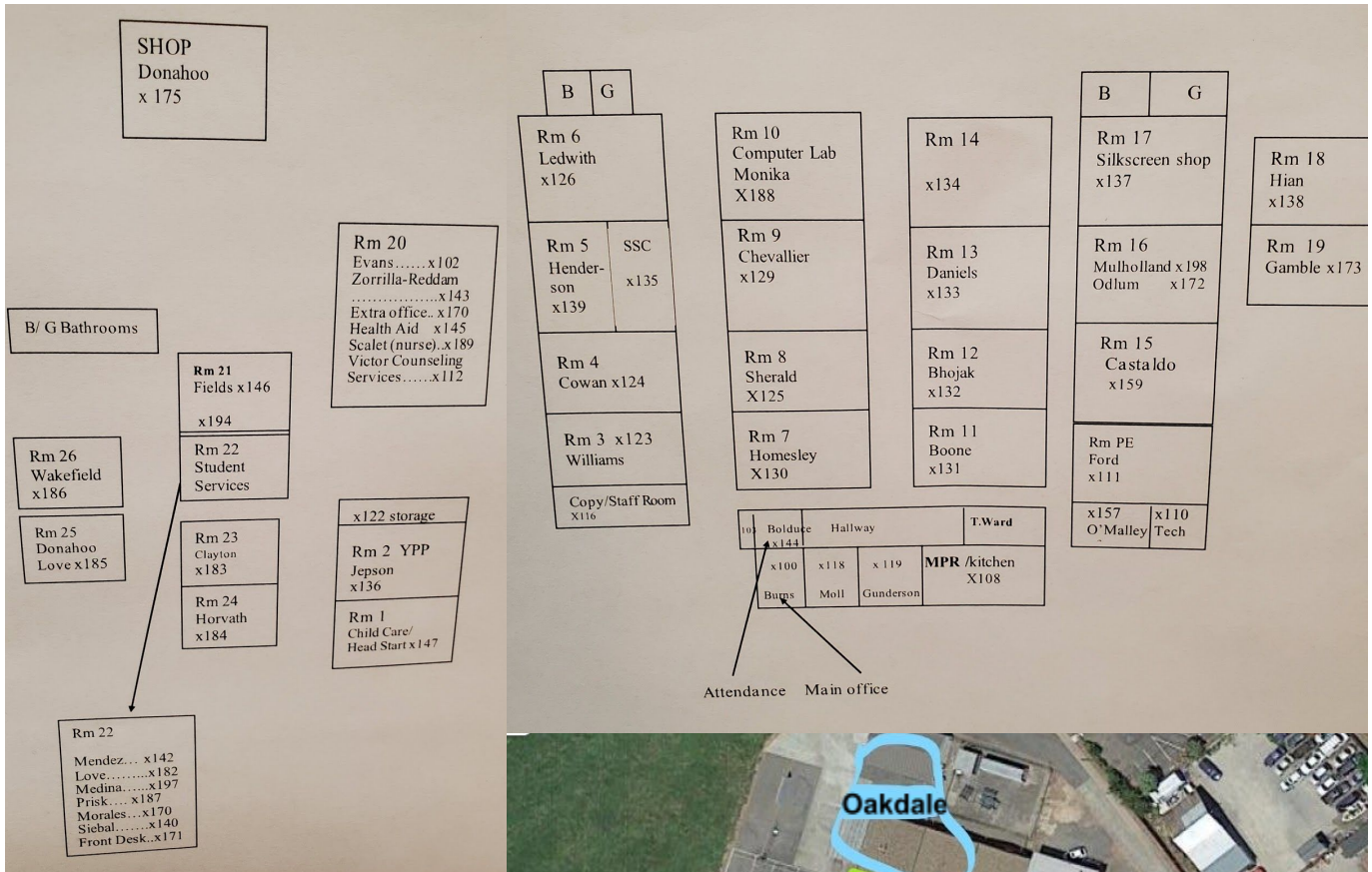

Confused about the credit system at Fair View? 🤔
 It's a bit different than other schools, let's take a look:



FVHS Variable Credit System

Sample Schedule

| Periods/Class | Credit | ELC | Total |
|---------------|-----------|----------|-----------|
| 1. English | 3 | 1 | 4 |
| 2. Math | 3 | 1 | 4 |
| 3. History | 3 | 1 | 4 |
| 4. Science | 3 | 1 | 4 |
| 5. PE | 3 | 1 | 4 |
| 6. Fine Art | 3 | 1 | 4 |
| 7. Elective | 3 | 1 | 4 |
| | 21 | 7 | 28 |
| 8. English | 3 | 1 | 4 |
| | 24 | 8 | 32 |

Each class is worth **3 credits per quarter** (Session). The Extended Learning Component (Home Work) for each class is worth another **1 credit per class**. Students can earn up to **4 credits per class per quarter** (Session).

Variable credit simply means Credits are based on the amount of work you turn in and the letter grade is based on the quality of the work turned in.

A student in a 7-period day can earn a total of 28 credits per quarter (Session) and **112 credits per year**. If you complete the ELC in each class.

A student in an 8-period day can earn a total of 32 credits per quarter (Session) and **128 credits per year**. If you complete the ELC in each class.

Chico High and PV offer 30 credits per semester for a total of 60 credits per year.

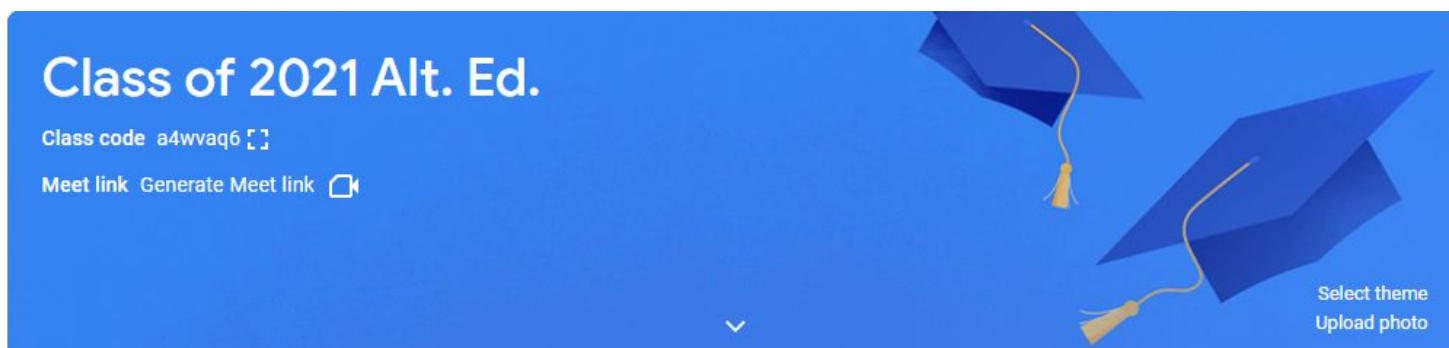
